

Ngcobo goes for platinum

THE Kloof branch of the Centre of Computers 4 Kids recently issued its first platinum certificate in South Africa to Muntuwenkosi William Ngcobo.

The Kloof franchise of the organisation has trained and qualified the first adult student in South Africa to gain the new platinum certificate. This certificate is a precursor to the full ICDL (International Computer Driving Licence) international certificate recognised.
